Macquarie City Campus is the Sydney CBD campus of Macquarie University.

Conveniently located above Wynyard train station and just thirty minutes direct to Macquarie University, North Ryde, Macquarie City Campus is minutes from the Australian Stock Exchange, Martin Place and many international business headquarters and close to main tourist attractions, including the Sydney Opera House, the Rocks, and Sydney Harbour Bridge.

### **Academic experts**

### **How do I accept my UAC offer to Macquarie City Campus?**

A condition of enrolment for all Commonwealth supported students is the completion an eCAF. When completing an eCAF you agree to the Commonwealth Government giving the University its portion for the cost of your studies and you agree to pay the student contribution amount via:

an up-front payment with a 20% discount or;

a HECS-HELP loan i.e. repaying your fees through the tax system once in full-time employment (a Tax File Number is required in this instance).

### **How do I complete my Commonwealth Assistance Form?**

- Open your eStudent Account (this will be given to you on orientation day);
- Open My Offer Tab;
- open Item B – Submit Commonwealth Assistance Form;
- choose the course you are currently “Admitted” into. If not Admitted choose the most recently “Offered” course;
- select “Enter a new Commonwealth Assistance Form”;
- select – “Available Forms”;
- you will be given the choice of either selecting a HECS-HELP or FEE-HELP application (choose the HECS HELP option);
- click on “I want to complete the selected form”

Once lodging the form it should be automatically approved. If this does not occur contact the Commonwealth Loans Scheme Officer at the Coursework Studies Section, Macquarie University, North Ryde on 9850 6410 [www.studentadmin.mq.edu.au](http://www.studentadmin.mq.edu.au)

**Tax File Numbers**

If you are an Australian citizen or permanent resident (humanitarian visa status) you are entitled to defer your university fees to the Australian Taxation Office as long as you have provided the University with a Tax File Number (TFN) by the census date on Friday, 8<sup>th</sup> April 2011.

If you do not have been issued a TFN or, do not have it with you, you must tick in Question 11 (Payment Options) that you intend to pay your fees upfront. This will allow the HECS-HELP form to be approved so, you can enrol in units. This does not mean you have to pay your fees upfront. As long as you have provided your TFN by the census date then fees can be deferred.

**How do I pay my fees?**

The details of your student account are available on eStudent, which you will gain access to on enrolment day. Login to eStudent and choose 'Check My Finances/Outstanding Debt'. The link 'View my current debts' will display all of the amounts currently outstanding on your student account.

Note:

Australian Permanent residents must **make full upfront payment of fees (no discount is applicable)** before the census date (Friday 8<sup>th</sup> April 2011). Failure to do so will result in the cancellation of enrolment. A late payment penalty of \$200 will apply if payment is made after 5 working days of enrolment date.

The 20% discount only applies to payments made before census date (Australian Citizens only).

Students that make an upfront payment of tuition fees must do so within 5 working days of enrolling in units. **A late fee of \$200** will be charged if a payment is made after 5 days from the enrolment date. This applies to all local students, including permanent residents too.

Any payments made after census date will not be accepted by the University. Payments after this date can only be made to the Australian Tax Office.

### Can I apply for credit for previous studies?

If you have completed previous studies at TAFE, University or a private educational provider, during orientation please bring your original transcripts to Level 2, 11 York Street, where we will copy them and apply for exemptions on your behalf.

It would be beneficial for you, to submit these documents at your earliest convenience so, we can finalise your exemptions prior to enrolment. If you would like to submit your documents before orientation, please send them to the MQC admissions team at:
